In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to present the 2019 Crop Report for Santa Cruz County. The report represents estimated acreage, yield and gross values of agricultural products produced in Santa Cruz County.

The total gross production value of Santa Cruz County agricultural commodities for 2019 is \$625,331,000. This represents a decrease of 8.5 percent, or \$57,681,000 below the 2018 production value of \$683,012,000. Gross production yield and value is influenced by factors such as weather, labor, and the marketplace.

It is important to emphasize that figures presented in this report are gross values and do not include costs incurred by growers that include but are not limited to labor, land preparation, irrigation, pest management, transportation, cooling, marketing, equipment, assessments, regulatory costs or loss experienced by individual operations. Also, the figures do not reflect the total contribution of agriculture to the economy of Santa Cruz County. Farm employment and other farm-related services add significant value and benefits to the local economy.

Strawberries remain the number one crop in Santa Cruz County with an estimated value of \$180,884,000 on approximately 2,308 planted acres. Raspberries continue to be our number two crop with an estimated value of \$139,616,000. Berries (strawberries, raspberries, and blackberries) saw an overall decrease in gross value of 14 percent, or \$61,033,000 compared to 2018 for a total value of \$373,298,000. Berries represent approximately 60 percent of the total gross production value for our County.

Vegetable production remained strong in Santa Cruz County with an overall value of \$94,636,000, a slight increase over the 2018 production value of \$92,458,000. Nursery crops had an overall strong year with a total value of \$119,483,000, an increase of nearly 9 percent over the 2018 value of \$109,819,000. 2019 saw the introduction of industrial hemp as a new commodity in California. There is much interest in growing industrial hemp and although approximately 132 acres were harvested in our County no gross production value was available to report as growers focused primarily on finding varieties that would do well in our area.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to all the farmers, ranchers, boards, commissions, packinghouses and agencies who contributed vital data without which this report would not be possible, and many thanks to my staff for their dedication to compiling and producing the 2019 Santa Cruz County Crop Report.




