I am pleased to present the 2024 Crop Report for Santa Cruz County pursuant to Sections 2272 and 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code. The total estimated gross production value of Santa Cruz County agricultural commodities for 2024 is \$741,917,000, an increase of 13.3% from 2023. Gross production yield and value are influenced by factors such as weather, labor, and the marketplace.

As always, it is important to note that figures presented in this report are gross values and do not include costs incurred by growers such as but not limited to, labor, land preparation, irrigation, integrated pest management, transportation, harvest, cooling, marketing, and regulatory costs. These figures also do not reflect the total contribution of agriculture to the economy of Santa Cruz County; farm employment and other farm-related services add significant value and benefits to the local economy.

Strawberries remain the number one crop in Santa Cruz County with an estimated value of \$218,925,000 on approximately 2,640 planted acres. Although price remained relatively steady, the total gross production value for strawberries increased by approximately 18% compared to 2023, due to an increase in acreage and tons harvested. Production and acreage increases were attributable to growers alternating or converting more acres to berry crops and a long growing season. Berries overall (strawberries, raspberries and blackberries) represent 60 percent of the total gross production value for the County.

We also saw increases in nursery crops and vegetable production in 2024 by about 12% and 8% respectively compared to 2023. Nursery crops (nursery stock, cut flowers, and cut greens) had a good year with a gross value of \$162,448,000 in 2024, while vegetable crops saw an 8% increase to \$97,869,000. Apples saw a bump in both harvested tons per acre and in price per ton in 2024, with an increase in production value of approximately 12%, at \$13,321,000. Wine grapes held fairly steady at 600 acres in production and a value of \$5,737,000.

Blackberries are featured on the cover of this year's report. Often grown under tunnel-houses around the Watsonville and the Pajaro Valley areas, blackberry production has seen a steady increase in the county for the last several years, reaching 1,310 planted acres in 2024.

Special thanks to my dedicated staff for their hard work in compiling this report, and to the growers and ranchers of Santa Cruz County who generously and voluntarily provided their valuable data. This report would not be possible without their continued support and cooperation.




ORGANIC FARMING
